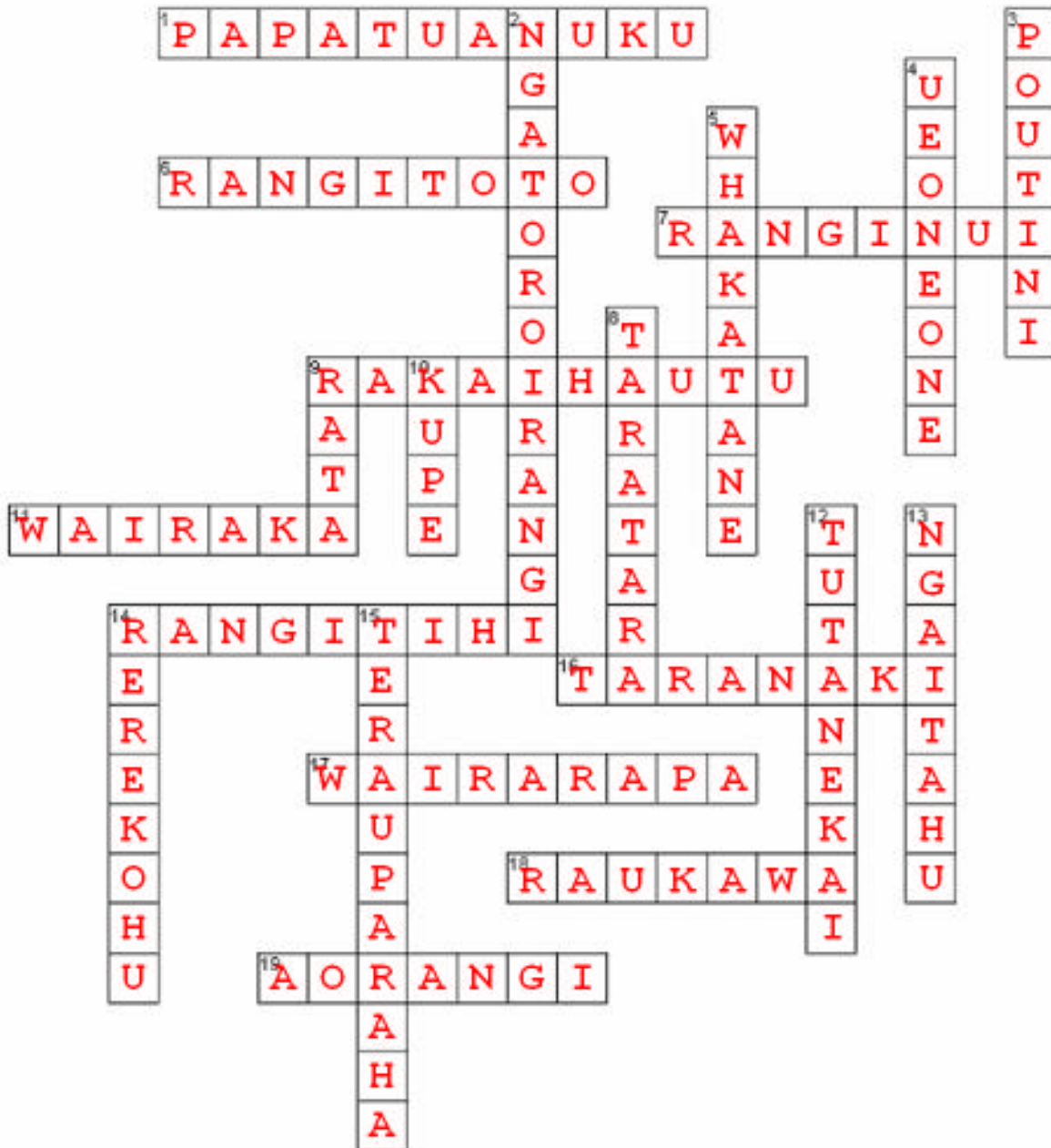

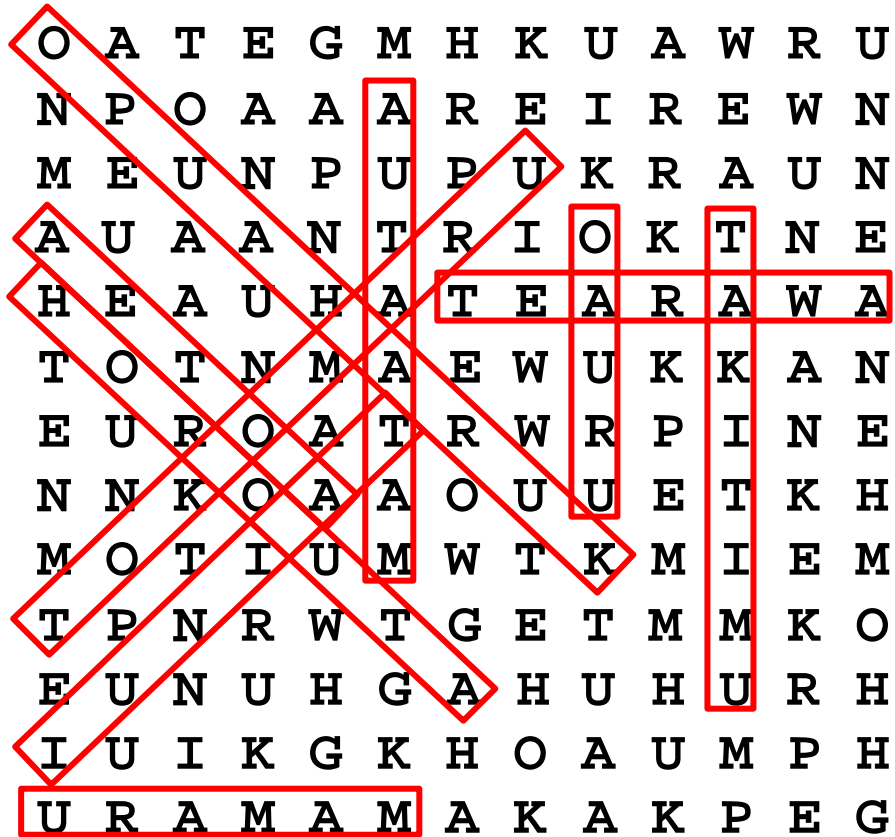

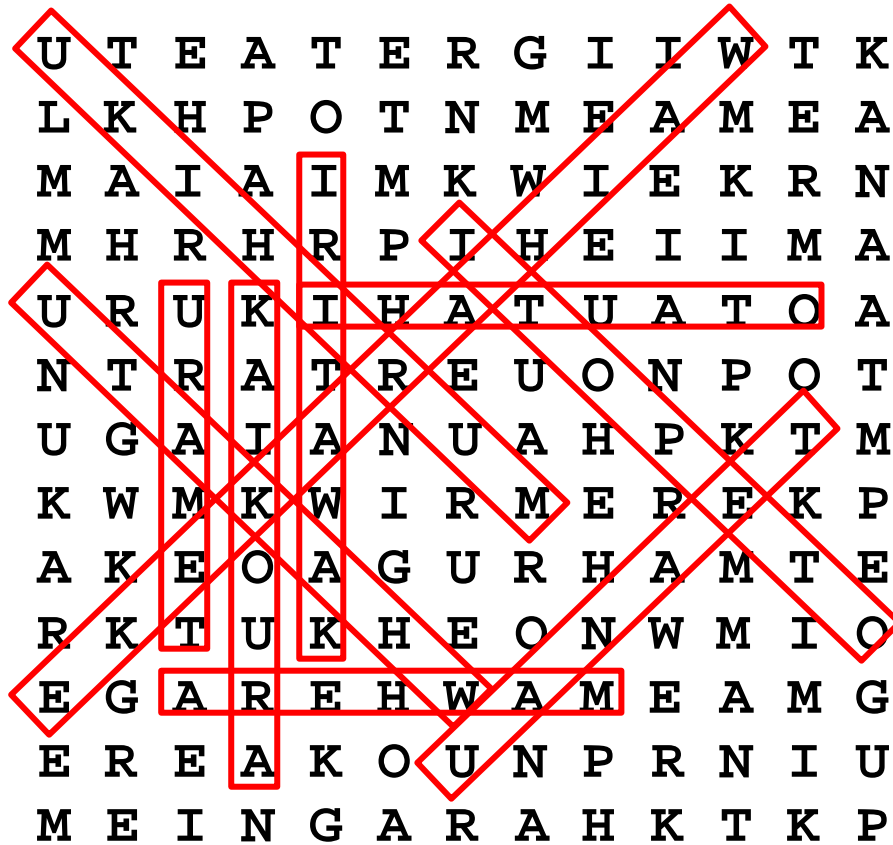
Wordfind 1

Cloze Activity 1

‘Ngätoroirangi’

Ngatoroirangi, **tohunga** of the **Te Arawa** canoe explored inland venturing to the southwest naming various **landmarks** along the way.
